**Federal Work-Study/Community Service/America Reads Program Eligibility Chart for the Academic Year 2011–2012**

The effective dates of the 2011–2012 academic year Federal Work-Study (FWS)/Community Service/America Reads Program are as follows:

**Undergraduate Students: Hourly only**

Fall semester: August 29, 2011 through December 16, 2011  
Intersession Funding: **To Be Announced**  
Spring semester: January 30, 2012 through May 17, 2012

**Graduate Students: Hourly and Salary**

Fall Semester: September 1, 2011 through January 15, 2012  
Spring Semester: January 16, 2012 through May 31, 2012

NOTE: Employers will be responsible for 100% of the student's salary for students who work beyond the published FWS dates. Students should plan on earning approximately one half of their total FWS/Community Service/America Reads award during the fall and one half during the spring semester, unless the original award is for one semester only. Students may, of course, work fewer hours if they so choose. For adjustments to FWS/Community Service/America Reads award, students must contact their financial aid advisor in the Office of Student Financial Services.

**The final day undergraduates may use their FWS/Community Service/America Reads award is May 17, 2012. All hours for the academic year must be entered by the hiring department into CATS (Cross Application Time Sheet) for the 6/15/2012 pay date. This chart is designed to assist you in estimating the number of hours per week a student will need to work in order to earn their full FWS/Community Service/America Reads award. **Employing supervisors and students are expected to keep track of cumulative earnings and to make whatever adjustments are necessary so that students do not exceed their total FWS/Community Service/America Reads award.** Students may work up to 20 hours per week during the academic year. The current minimum wage rate is \$7.25 per hour. There is no cap on the hourly wage rate.

Example for chart below: If an academic year Federal Work-Study award is \$2500, and the student earns \$8.00/hr., the student should plan on working approximately 9.8 hours each week in order to earn their full eligibility of \$2500. Adjust hours per week upward if you will be working fewer than 32 weeks. (8/29/2011–5/17/2012 excluding Intersession = approx. 32 weeks.)
