

Medical /Clinical Documentation for Special Housing Placement

Medical documentation is required to request special housing placement. Special housing placements are granted based only on medically-documented need. No request can be considered for any circumstances beyond documented medical need. The request will be evaluated and approval or denial will be communicated directly to the student.

The following questions must be answered by the student's healthcare provider treating the condition for which this request is based. Documentation should be typed on professional letterhead and returned to the housing office, to the attention of the Director of Housing by May 13, 2011 for incoming students for Fall Semester.

Please be aware that this information may be shared with the Director of the Student Health Center, the Director of Disability Services, or the Director of the Counseling Center, depending on the nature of the request.

- 1) Please explain in detail the diagnosis and current treatment that warrants consideration in your patient's college housing assignment.
- 2) How long has the student had this condition?
- 3) What is the severity of this condition?
- 4) Is there the expectation that this condition will extend past the upcoming academic year?
- 5) How does this medical condition or disability specifically impact the students' living environment?
- 6) Please explain in detail the living arrangements required to fill this expressed need.
- 7) What are the medical / psychological / physical ramifications, if this need is not approved?
