

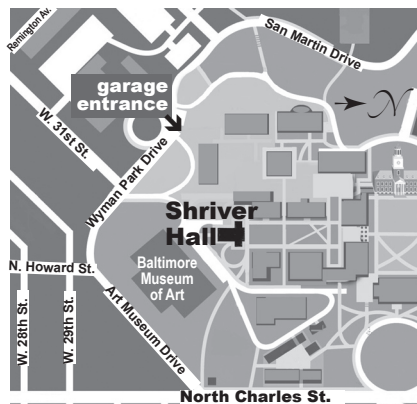
Hopkins Symphony Orchestra 2010-2011

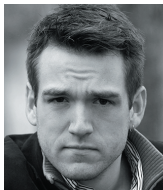
