Incident Type: Armed Robbery

Location: 200 Block E. 33rd Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21218

Date: July 3, 2013

Time: 5:00 AM

Summary:

A non-affiliate was waiting at the bus stop along the north sidewalk in the 200 block of E. 33rd Street when he observed two Black males walking west on the north sidewalk coming towards him. Suspect one was a Black male, early 20's, clean shaven, 5'6" and between 130-150 lbs. wearing a red shirt and blue jeans. Suspect two was a Black male, early 20's, 5'8" and between 130-150 lbs. wearing a black ski mask, khaki hoodie and blue jeans. Suspect one (wearing red shirt) pulled a black semi-automatic handgun from his waist and pointed it at the victim's head. He ordered the victim to empty his pockets and the victim complied. The following property was taken: cell phone, wallet containing \$10 cash, driver's license, debit card and social security card. Suspect two (wearing ski mask) took the property from the victim and both suspects fled east on E. 33rd Street, last seen running south in the 3200 block of Guilford Ave. When the suspects were out of sight, the victim ran home and called the police. No injuries were sustained by the victim.

Baltimore Police and campus officers checked the area with negative results. Investigation continuing.

Suspect Info:

Suspect #1- B/M, 5'6," 130-150 lbs., early 20's, wearing a red shirt, blue jeans

Suspect #2- B/M, 5'8", 130-150 lbs., early 20's, wearing a black ski mask, khaki hoodie, blue jeans

When Confronted During a Robbery – Give the robber whatever is demanded. Don't make any sudden, unexpected movements because they may be interpreted as a threat. If the suspect claims he has a weapon, even if it is not displayed, be cooperative and do not force his bluff. Be a good witness and look for scars, marks, tattoos, limps, etc. Notify the police as soon as possible from a safe, well lighted area.

Take the profit out of robbery by not carrying large sums of money or credit cards on your person whenever possible.

If you carry a purse, carry it close to your body. Do not place the strap across your body or over your shoulder. If a robber were to grab your purse, you may be pulled along with the robber until the strap breaks or you are pulled down.

- Call 911 or Campus Safety and Security 410-516-7777 right away. The first minutes after a crime occurs are critical to law enforcement.
