

## **Health Science Policy Analyst, National Institutes of Health, Bethesda MD**

The Office of Strategic Coordination (OSC) is seeking an experienced Health Science Policy Analyst to join their team. OSC is responsible for the oversight of the NIH Common Fund which supports cross-cutting, trans-NIH programs that require participation by at least two NIH Institutes or Centers (ICs) or would otherwise benefit from strategic planning and coordination.

The ideal candidate for the Health Science Policy Analyst position will have knowledge of biomedical research programs and arising issues; have excellent oral, written, and interpersonal skills; have the ability to administer health science policy and program initiatives; and have the ability to establish working relationships with other scientists.

This position is located in the Office of the Director (OD), Division of Program Coordination, Planning, and Strategic Initiatives (DPCPSI), Office of Strategic Coordination (OSC).

As a Health Science Policy Analyst for the Office of Strategic Coordination, some of your key duties and responsibilities will include:

Providing expert advice, guidance, and assistance to OSC leadership on biomedical, scientific, and health policy issues affecting the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and the national and international biomedical research communities.

Identifying major issues, roadblocks, and potential actions necessary for policy development and interpretation.

Developing reports and other documents on NIH policies, programs, plans, priorities, and activities

Analyzing policy developments, directives, and plans of the Administration and Department and their impact on the agency and formulating recommended approaches for addressing issues raised.

Maintaining knowledge of scientific, policy, and legislative developments that may affect the NIH and/or the biomedical and behavioral research communities or have implications for current and planned health research and research training programs.

### **Requirements:**

You must possess a full 4-year course of study in an accredited college or university leading to a bachelor's or higher degree with major study in an academic field related to the health sciences or allied sciences appropriate to the work of the position.
