

**Postdoctoral positions in the  
Epidemiology and Biostatistics of Aging**



The **Epidemiology and Biostatistics of Aging training program** at Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health is currently **seeking a postdoctoral fellow** for a period of  $X$  years. Candidates receive mentoring and training to become investigators who can conduct leading-edge epidemiological research on the health of older populations, and develop, implement and evaluate prevention programs, for the aging population. Postdoctoral fellows are expected to participate in on-going significant clinical and population-based research on aging and older adults across multiple institutions at Johns Hopkins. Postdoctoral fellows acquire special expertise in conducting gerontological research under the guidance of a mentor. For some post-doctoral fellows, additional training can be acquired in coordination with a clinical fellowship training program. All trainees participate in regular seminars on aging and research in progress meetings, and work with core faculty on existing or newly developed research projects on aging. For some postdoctoral fellows, enrollment in a degree program at the Master's level may be appropriate. This program is funded by the National Institute on Aging and provides a stipend for postdoctoral fellows, with potential for tuition support. Suitable applicants will hold a Ph.D. in Epidemiology, Biostatistics, or other quantitatively oriented population health field; or an M.D. with dedication to pursuit of geriatrics and development of methodological skills. **Candidates must have US citizenship or permanent residence** status to be eligible. Minority and women applicants are encouraged to apply.
