

Social Epidemiologist, UCSF Program on Reproductive Health and the Environment, Oakland, CA

The UCSF Program on Reproductive Health and the Environment (PRHE) is seeking a Postdoctoral scientist or Junior faculty in social epidemiology or a related field with expertise on health disparities. PRHE is collaborating with the California Breast Cancer Research Program (CBCRP) to develop and implement the California Breast Cancer Prevention Initiatives. The Prevention Initiatives involves the development of research strategies and recommendations made to the CBCRP Council over the four years.

An estimated \$24 million will be dedicated to directed, coordinated, and collaborative research to pursue the most compelling and promising approaches to research on breast cancer, the environment and disparities, population-level interventions (including policy research) on known or suspected breast cancer risk factors and protective measures, and targeted interventions for high-risk individuals.

Requirements:

The successful candidate must have a PhD in public health, epidemiology, medical anthropology, sociology or other health related field and a demonstrated knowledge of health disparities and inequities. Well-qualified doctoral students may be considered. Knowledge of environmental health a plus.
